




Treason Trial Defence Fund

Canon Collins launches the **Treason Trial Defence Fund** to raise money to pay the legal fees of 156 anti-apartheid activists, including Chief Albert Luthuli and Nelson



International Defence and Aid Fund and Rivenia Trial

BDAF is reconstituted as the International Defence and Aid Fund (IDAF), with Canon Collins serving as President. Branches are formed in Britain, New Zealand, Scandinavia, Holland and India. IDAF pays the legal costs for defendants of the **Rivonia Trial**, in which Nelson Mandela is convicted of Treason and sentenced to life imprisonment.



> Canon Collins and IDAF colleague Ethel de Keyser set up a trust to fund exiled activists and their children to study in the UK and other countries, acquiring the knowledge and skills they need to contribute to the new democracies predicted to emerge in southern Africa. After Collins' death, the organisation is renamed Canon Collins Educational Trust for Southern Africa.
